This fund was established by TrueCore Federal Credit Union to assist their members who are high school seniors or current college students demonstrating outstanding achievement and wish to further their studies at an accredited college or university. This scholarship was created in memory of Cindy Roback, whose efforts as Chief Operations Officer at TrueCore Federal Credit Union encouraged the education and involvement of youth.

The Dupler Brothers Law Enforcement Scholarship Fund was established by Margery Dupler to honor her husband, Philip H. Dupler, and his brothers, Edgar M. Dupler and George A. Dupler. The brothers served as policemen in the City of Newark for a total of more than seventy-five years. The scholarship is awarded to graduating seniors from a Licking County high school pursuing law enforcement and students studying law enforcement at OSU-N or COTC.



The Oyler Agrarian Scholarship Fund was established in 1998 by Clayton Oyler to honor his mother and father, Alva L. and Caroline Oyler. The scholarship is awarded to a Licking County or a contiguous county high school senior pursuing a course of study related to agriculture. The Oyler's farm, located in Luray, was home to the 1936 National Corn Huskers Contest, which attracted over 140,000 people.



The Larry, Jean, Mike, Tim and Darren Brandt Family Scholarship was established in 2004 by Lawrence and Jean Ann Brandt in memory of their son, Timothy Randall Brandt. Timothy was diagnosed with cancer at the age of 17 and endured numerous treatments. He enjoyed living life to its fullest. Throughout his ordeal, he never asked, "why me?" The scholarship assists Licking County students who are survivors of childhood cancer to further their studies at an accredited two-year or four-year college or university.



SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS COME FROM MANY BACKGROUNDS



2016-2017 Scholarship RECIPIENTS

The Foundation's Governing Committee recently approved scholarship funding in the total amount of \$976,008 for 2016. Licking County Foundation's Director, Connie Hawk said, "These scholarship awards are made possible by hundreds of generous donors who are passionate about higher education and believe the future of our community depends upon a well-educated and experienced workforce."

\$884,008 was recently offered to nearly 300 area high school seniors, college students and adult re-entry students from 75 scholarship funds established by generous donors who have made an investment in the future of students from Licking County. The scholarship awards—ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000—are in recognition of each recipient's achievements and commitment to higher education. Scholarship recipients were selected by the Foundation's 61-member, volunteer Scholarship Review Committee from a pool of 837 applicants who submitted 5,399 applications.

An additional \$92,000 will be awarded to students attending The Ohio State University-Newark Campus and the Central Ohio Technical College from five Licking County Foundation scholarship funds: the Clarence W. and Grace Marie Feil Scholarship, the Pastorius Battat Scholarship, the James W. Pyle Memorial Scholarship, the Alethea E. and Norman R. Sleight Scholarship, and the newly-established Mike Johnson McDonald's Scholarship. Recipients of these scholarships will be selected by the colleges following criteria established by the funds' donors.


Four Scholarships MAKE INNAUGURAL AWARDS

AUSTIN CAREINS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
In memory of their son, Austin Michael Careins, Troy and Chasity Hartman established this fund in 2015. Austin graduated from Licking Valley High School in 2011 with honors.
